#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

**Mr. Ian McIntosh (Legislative Chair, FSMTA)** voiced concerns brought from FSMTA members concerning “stretch labs” in the context of the scope of practice of massage therapists, as well as concerns about whether SportsClips is providing massage services. Mr. McIntosh also addressed specific concerns with access to prior courses in CEBroker, for the purposes of confirming education completion for former students.

**Mr. Adam Driggers** provided additional insight as to stretch facilities approaching massage therapy students who had not yet graduated.

**Ms. Laura Embleton (Director of Government Relations, ABMP)** provided perspective on the proposed massage therapy compact (IMPACT):

- 7 states have to pass the compact into law for the compact to begin rule drafting.
- Compact will require 625 hours of education, national examination, licensure in a home state.
- Several states will not be able to enter the compact based on current projected requirements.

**Ms. Laura Embleton (Director of Government Relations, ABMP)** provided that the term ‘illicit massage business,’ as used in discussions, is a misnomer for illicit sex business.

**Mr. Adam Driggers** inquired if there was a way for applications for school approval to be submitted and reviewed prior to CIE approval.

**Ms. K. Hazelton** expressed her interest in the meeting as a prospective school owner and provided feedback to the board about the informative nature of the meeting.
